1: Dinah - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 200 - 300

John Harper Ltd. English - 1920. This is a classic coin swallowing bank.



2: Tammany - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 100 - 150

J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - 1870's. Place your penny in his hand, the weight of the penny will cause his arm to lower. Depositing your coin "bribe" into his pocket, he will then nod in thanks for your deposit.



3: Novelty - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 250 - 350

J. & E. Stevens. Cromwell, CT - 1873. Open the door and place a coin on the tray. A tap to the open door will cause it to snap shut quickly and deposit the coin into the bank.



4: Two Humpty Dumpty - Cast Iron Mechanical Banks

USD 300 - 400

By the Shepard Hardware Company. Buffalo, New York - Circa 1890's. This is a classic coin swallowing bank.



5: Cabin - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 300 - 400

Made by J. & E. Stevens Co. Cromwell, Ct. - Circa 1880's. Place your penny on the roof, pull the broom handle. This will cause the man to flip upside, kicking your coin into the bank.



6: Mammy - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 2,250 - 2,750

By Kyser & Rex Company. Philadelphia, Pa. - Ca. 1885. When the lever is pressed, a coin placed on the bowl of her spoon will be deposited into the child's mouth. Coins can also be collected through the pocket slot in her apron.



7: Monkey & Coconut - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 800 - 1.000

J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - 1890's. This clever chimp drops pennies from his right hand into his coconut. At the same time, he rolls his eyes and laughs at you.



8: Bad Accident - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 950 - 1,250

J & E Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut, Circa 1888. When the bank is activated, a little boy emerges from behind the bulrushes, frightening the mule and thereby toppling the cart backwards. In so doing, the coin has been deposited.



9: Spise a Mule, Bench - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 400 - 600

J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, CT - 1897. A boy has jumped off his mule to give him some discipline, admonishing the lowly beast with the stick in his hand. However, the mule turns the tables on the boy, spinning around and kicking him over.



10: Teddy and the Bear - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 550 - 750

Made by the J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Ct. - Circa 1910. The imagery portrayed in this remarkable bank draws from an actual incident from Teddy's adventurous life. While hunting for bear in the south, Roosevelt exhibited great compassion for the well-being of an injured and sick bear, giving him a reputation as animal rights advocate.

18: Owl Slot in Head - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

Kilgore Mfg. Company. Westerville, OH - 1930's. Push a coin into his head and his eyes will roll back.



19: Liliput - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 275 - 350

Made by J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - Early 1880's. When coins are placed on the teller's tray, the weight causes him to pivot leftward to make your deposit.



20: Owl Turns Head - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 175 - 225

Made by the J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - 1880's. Put a coin in the tree branch and press the lever. The owl's head turns and the coin drops into the aperture. Release the lever and his head snaps back.



21: Toy Stove & Toothpick Dispenser - Cast Iron

USD 75 - 100

American - 1890's - 1920's. Both made of Cast Iron. Eagle stove with tin backing.



22: Santa Claus - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 350 - 450

Made by Shepard Hardware Company. Buffalo, New York 1889. Place a coin in Santa's hand. Depress the lever and he deposits it into the chimney.



23: Speaking Dog - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 400 - 500

Shepard Hardware Company. Buffalo, NY - 1885. To work, place a penny on the tray in her hand and then push down on the lever. This will cause the dog's mouth to open and its tail to wag.



24: "GEM" Faithful Dog - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 200 - 250

H. L. Judd Co. Wallingford, CT. 1880's. Pull the dog into place. Put a penny on his tray. Raise his tail and he will deposit your coin into the building in a flash!



25: Bear Hugs Tree - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

Made by the Judd Mfg. Company. Wallingford, Connecticut - 1880's. Put a penny on the tip of his tongue. Wiggle the lever and he will gobble your penny up whole.



26: Bulldog - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

Coin Balances on his Nose. Made by J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - Ca. 1880. This clever canine carefully balances coins on the tip of his nose before he gobbles them up.



27: Monkey & Coconut - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 600 - 800

J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - 1890's. This clever chimp drops pennies from his right hand into his coconut. At the same time, he rolls his eyes and laughs at you.



28: Creedmoor - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 225 - 275

J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - 1877. A classic shooting bank.



29: Stump Speaker - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

Made by Shepard Hardware Company. Buffalo, NY - 1880's. Place a coin in his hand, depress the lever, and the coin is deposited to the bank.



30: Darktown - Cast Iron Mechanical Bank

USD 800 - 1,000

Made by J. & E. Stevens Company. Cromwell, Connecticut - Late 1880's. The sporting theme, vivid color and dynamic action make the Darktown Battery one of the great favorites of collectors. Pennies placed in the pitcher's right hand are tossed to the catcher. Simultaneously, the batter attempts to swing but strikes out.
